We spent a Saturday morning at the Botanical Gardens in Entebbe. It was a great place to get away from the city to enjoy the quiet and the monkeys.






#### What takes place in our ministry?

Our ministry with MAF is a lot of behind the scenes kind of work, that's just the nature of being a mechanic. Each day Nathan heads out to the hangar to do his part in keeping these planes flying. Recently while helping the Uganda team with their maintenance on 5X-LDR, the turbine engine Caravan, Nathan was involved in a "hot section inspection" The "hot section", refers to the area in the engine that comes after the fuel is burned, the turbines are part of this and because they spin over 38,000 rotations per minute and will see temperatures over 800 degrees Celsius, they are considered "hot". These are extreme operating conditions and after an engine has been run for so many hours, these parts must be disassembled, and inspected. This time it was LDR's turn. It was parked in the hangar for several days while the team disassembled and closely inspected these parts for damage or deterioration. Once they were happy that everything was in good working order, it was put back together and sent back into service, where it will continue to be used in the ministries that God is using MAF for in Uganda.

The plane mentioned above makes many trips up to the more northern areas of Uganda and recently one of our pilots flew a medical team from Seattle, Washington, up to Moroto. This is what they had to say about their recent time here and the work they are doing to help the people:

"This year we served 1,850 men women and children over three days at a church in the Katwe slum... we were joined in that work by volunteer Ugandan doctors, nurses, and lab technicians. MAF flew 10 of us to




It is exciting to partner with groups like this, enabling them to spend less time traveling and more time with the people.

A couple of weeks ago, Nathan and I were also able to ride along on a flight going up to this area. We left Kajjansi airstrip and headed to Moroto, then on to Kotido, Gulu, then home to Kajjansi. It was a great experience to see the land and to talk with the passengers about the work they are doing in the northern parts of Uganda. Most organizations base out of Kampala or Entebbe, so many of the workers, travel to and from as they support the work in the villages, or come into the city for training or supplies. It was wonderful to see and hear first-hand how MAF is making a difference in helping the people of Uganda.
